

Feeding Instructions Prior to Determination of Resting Insulin¹

Do NOT fast horse; follow feeding instructions listed below.

The resting-insulin procedure is used as an assessment of the postprandial insulin response.

Procedure:

- 1. Do not feed grain within four hours of collecting blood for resting-insulin testing.
- 2. If horse is stabled, leave horse on hay (do not remove hay) prior to collecting blood for resting insulin.
- 3. If horse is kept on pasture, leave horse on pasture prior to collecting blood for resting insulin.
- 4. If horse is on pasture and also fed hay, leave it on pasture and hay prior to collecting blood for resting insulin.

Interpretation of Resting-Insulin Results¹

Result	Interpretation	Recommendation
<20 uU/mL	Non-diagnostic or normal	Dynamic test recommended to better assess — Oral sugar test
20–50 uU/mL	Suspect insulin dysregulation	Dynamic test recommended to better assess — Oral sugar test
>50 uU/mL	Insulin dysregulation (ID)	Proceed with ID management
